1 DECLARATION OF INTERESTS

2 LICENSING ACT 2003 – SECTION 34 HEARING REPORT

Mr Ward, the Chairman of the Licensing and Appeals Committee, chaired the hearing meeting. He referred to the procedure to be followed, a copy of which had been circulated with the Agenda, and introduced the Members and officers present.

The Head of Environment submitted a report ([Paper N22](#)) to enable the Committee to consider an application under the 2003 Licensing Act for a new premises licence for ‘At Number 10’, Lady Street, Lavenham. He indicated that Mr Pitt had now withdrawn his objection due to the reduced application.

The Applicants made an opening address to the meeting in support of the application.

The Applicant was then questioned by Members and Officers.

Mr Evans then spoke on behalf of the objectors, and with the agreement of all parties, circulated photographs at the meeting.

The objectors were then questioned by the Applicant and Officers.

All parties were then requested to provide closing comments to the meeting. Following this all parties withdrew to enable the Committee to deliberate the Application.

The relevant parties were then invited back into the meeting and the Council's decision (which was unanimous) was notified.

RESOLVED

That the application under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 for a new premises licence in respect of 'At Number 10', 10 Lady Street, Lavenham be granted as the Committee can see no reason to refuse the application arising from promotion of the four licensing objectives on the following basis:-

- **Up to four films per year to be shown**
- **Mandatory conditions which apply**
- **Conditions consistent with the operating schedule (subject to a feasibility/enforcement assessment).**
